a. Capital Projects

Lyddane reviewed the project report included in the agenda packet.

- Lehigh playground replacement is in process, with new equipment projected to be installed in September.
- Construction on Monteith Riverpark is nearly complete. The restroom has been redone, gazebo painted, power poles painted, and the playground installation is almost complete. Lyddane will provide a sneak peek to commission members before the official opening of the park on July 4, 2024.
- Fencing around the patio at the Riverfront Community Center has been installed.
- b. Staff reports

Barnett provided an update on Park Maintenance.

- Summer concerts will work with a new sound and lighting contractor. The lighting on the new stage is very well done.
- Park Maintenance staff are busy with spring maintenance as all things are growing.
- Parks have been hit hard with graffiti recently. Staff and volunteers are working diligently to get it covered as soon as possible.
- The Rotary Club of Albany and Stoked 2 Sk8 shop will be painting areas at the Albany Skate Park.
- Homeless camp clean-ups are taking place.
- Flowers in parks and around city facilities have been planted.

Lyddane noted the homeless camp battle is ongoing and is a larger issue being discussed at the state and national levels. Van Buren added that Adopt-a-Park volunteers are trying to work with the homeless population by providing them bags for trash disposal.

Lyddane provided an update on recreation programs.

- Maple Lawn Preschool is closing at the end of this school year, as the funding from GAPS is ending.
- The Waverly Duck is back in the lake.
- Paddle boats will open June 20, 2024.
- COOL Pool opens June 15, 2024, with new outdoor furniture.
- Aquatic harvesting at Waverly Lake will take place at the end of summer.
- Summer Sounds, River Rhythms and Northwest Art & Air Festival performers have been announced.
- Local sponsors provide much of the revenue and in-kind donations for summer events and concerts. The department is very fortunate to have a high level of community support.

- Seasonal recruitment is currently taking place. Looking for summer staff and a trips and tours driver.
- Trips and tours programs are filling to capacity.
- A line dancing class will be offered next week, funded through a small grant.
- The Albany Parks and Recreation Foundation Legacy Garden fundraiser has sold approximately 25 pieces that can honor an individual, group, or organization with their name on a flower petal or flower center.
