

Ordinance No. 107.

An Ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving Broadalbin Street from the Willamette River to the center of the Alley between First and Second Streets by building, Constructing and laying a sewer.

Sect. I. That that portion of Broadalbin Street lying between the Willamette River and the center of the Alley between First and Second Streets be improved by building, laying and Constructing a sewer as hereinafter provided.

Sect. II. That that portion of the street necessary for digging the sewer shall be cleared of all obstructions by, at the water mains, at the expense of the contractor, who shall open the pipes on land and remove all dirt, place all portions on the street improvement made by him, in as good condition as the same was at the time of commencing the work, except such portions as the Committee on "Streets & Public Property" may direct to be omitted.

Sect. III. The improvement shall consist of building, Constructing and laying a sewer of terra cotta pipe sixteen inches inside diameter, with catch basins, manholes, trap-holds, facets and branches at such places as may be designated.

Sect. IV. The work to be done and method used to be done in accordance with the survey to be made by the City Surveyor and the plans and specifications to be drafted by the Committee on Streets and Public Property and filed in the office of the City Recorder and Marshal, plans and specifications for a sewer from the Willamette River to the center of the Alley between First and Second Streets.

Sect. V. The Committee on "Streets and Public Property" shall at all times have the power to reject any material and parts the using by the Contractor in the construction of the sewer if in their judgment the same is unseaworthy or does not conform to the plan and specifications; and the same shall in all things be compelled to the entire satisfaction of the Committee on Streets and Public Property.

Section 11. The contractor shall take entire charge of the work during its progress, and shall be responsible for any loss or damage occasioned by his carelessness or neglect, and replace all such works, fixtures, supports or other fixtures removed by him in as good condition as when removed.

Section 12. That after the survey and plans and specifications, as provided by section four, shall be adopted by the Common Council of the City of Albany, shall proceed to let the contract, for building, laying and constructing the sewer which provides for, according to the laws providing for the same of letting Contract by the City.

Section 13. This ordinance to be in force from and after six days after its publication.
