An Ordinance to amend sections 24 27 & 28 of Ordinance No. 8 relating to the assessment levy and Collection of City taxes, and the granting and Collecting of licenses and imposing fines.

Be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Albany.

Section 24 That sections 24 27 and 28 of Ordinance No. 8 of the City of Albany relating to the assessment levy and Collection of City taxes, and the granting and Collecting of licenses and imposing and collecting fines, be amended so as to read as follows:

Section 24 All licenses issued as quarterly licenses shall expire the last day of each quarter, namely thirty-first of March, thirtieth of June, thirtieth of September and thirty-first of December, and no licenses shall be granted for less than one quarter, and all licenses shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of each year.

Section 27 Any person applying for a license to sell

spirituous or fermented malt liquors or wines, as provided in this ordinance shall execute a bond to the City of Albany in the penal sum of One Thousand Dollars, with two or more sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Mayor, Recorder, and Committee on Licenses, (which sureties shall justify in double the amount required in the bond). Conditional that the applicant or applicants for the license, will keep a decent and respectable house and that he or they will not permit any unlawful gaming or riotous conduct in or about his or their house, nor keep open his or their house on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, nor in anywise dispose of spirituous or fermented malt liquors or wines on said day; that he or they will not sell give or otherwise dispose of spirituous or fermented malt liquors or wines to minors under the age of twenty one years, or allow the same to be done on his or their premises during the continuance of his or their license; and in case of any violation of the foregoing conditions by any person or persons giving such a bond he or they shall on conviction thereof before the Recorder be liable to pay a fine of not less than one hundred dollars, or in default of the payment of the same to imprisonment in the City Jail not more than twenty days, and the bond so given as aforesaid by such applicant or applicants, shall be also be forfeited by

the City Marshall before the Recorder and forfeited to the City for any violation of its conditions; and provided that no person shall be surety or more than one bond at the same time, and that no keeper of a bar-room or drinking shop shall be allowed to be surety on the bond of the keeper of a bar-room or drinking shop.

Section 28. Every person keeping a bar-room or drinking shop shall pay a quarterly license of one hundred and twenty five dollars. Every person who keeps small or spirituous liquors or wines for sale at retail in less quantities than one quart either as his sole business or in connection with some other occupation shall be deemed a keeper of a bar-room or drinking shop under this ordinance. Every person who keeps small or spirituous liquors or wine for sale in quantities of one quart or upwards to be drunk on the premises, shall pay a quarterly license of fifty two and 50/100 dollars; provided that every keeper of a bar-room or drinking shop under this ordinance shall be and they are hereby authorized to keep without any license therefore, a billiard table, pool table, pigeon-table table, or devil among the tables table.

Section 29. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after March 31st 1882.
