

Ordinance No. 114.

An Ordinance to amend sections 24, 27 & 28 of
Ordinance 1158 relating to the assessment levy
and collection of City taxes, and the granting and
collecting of licenses and imposing fines. /
So it is ordained

by the Common Council of the City of Albany:

Section 24. That sections 24, 27 and 28 of ordinance 8th of the City of Albany relating to the assessment levy and collection of City taxes, and the granting and collecting of licenses and imposing and collecting fines, be intended to read as follows:

Section 24. All licenses issued as quarterly
licenses shall expire the last day of each quarter, namely
Thirty-first of March, Twelfth of June, Twelfth of
September and Thirteenth of December, and no license
shall be granted for less than one quarter, and all licenses
shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of
each year.

Section 27. Any person applying for a license to sell

Spiritous or fermented malt liquors or wines, so provided
in this ordinance, shall recite a bond to the City of Albany
in the sum of One Thousand Dollars, with two or more
sufficient sureties, to be approved by the Mayor, Recorder,
and Committee on Licenses, (which sureties shall justify in
double the amount required in the bond). Conditional that the
applicant or applicant for the license, will keep a decent
and respectable house and that he or they will not permit
any unlawful gaming or violent conduct in or about his or
their house, nor keep open his or their house on the first
day of the week commonly called Sunday, nor in any
wise dispose of spiritous or fermented malt liquors or wine
on said day. That he or they will not sell give or otherwise
dispose of spiritous or fermented malt liquors or wines to
minors under the age of twenty-one years, or allow the same
to be done on his or their premises during the continuance
of his or their license, and in case of any violation of the
foregoing conditions by any person or persons giving such
a bond he or they shall on conviction here of before the
Recorder be liable to pay a fine of not less than one
hundred dollars, or in default of the payment of the same
to imprisonment in the City jail not more than twenty
days, and the bond so given be increased by such
applicant or applicants, shall be liable to prosecute by

The City Marshall before the Recorder and forfeited to the City for any violation of its conditions, and provided that no person shall be surety or more than one bond at the same time, and that no keeper of a bar-room or drinking shop, shall be allowed to be surety for the bond of the keeper of a bar room or drinking shop.

Section 28. Every person keeping a bar room or drinking shop shall pay a quarterly license of one hundred and twenty-five dollars. Every person who keeps malt or spirituous liquors or wines for sale at a time in less quantities than one quart either as his sole business or in connection with some other occupation shall be deemed a keeper of a bar room or drinking shop under this ordinance. Every person who keeps malt or spirituous liquors or wine for sale in quantities of one quart or upwards to be drunk on the premises, shall pay a quarterly license of fifty-five and 6/100 dollars; provided that every keeper of a bar room or drinking shop under this ordinance shall be and they are hereby authorized to keep without any license therefore, a billiard table, pool table, ping-pong table, or devil among the tailors table.

Section 29. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after March 31st 1882.
