

Ordinance No. 131.

An Ordinance to amend^{the} Ordinance, entitled an
Ordinance to amend Sections 24-27 & 28 of Ordinance
no. 8, relating to the assessment, levy and collection of
Ord. 131 City Taxes, and the granting of Licenses, and the
Rep 1506 imposing and collecting of fines

Be it ordained

by the Common Council of the City of Albany.

Section I. That Sections 2 and 3 of Ordinance no. 115, entitled
An Ordinance to amend Sections 24-27 and 28 of
Ordinance no. 8, relating to the assessment, levy and
Collecting of City Taxes, and the granting and
Collecting of Licenses, and the imposing and
Collecting of fines, be amended so as to read as
follows:

Section II (24). All licenses issued under the provisions of Ordinance
no. 8, relating to the assessment, levy, and collecting
of City Taxes, and the granting and collecting of
licenses, and the imposing and collecting of fines,
and all ordinances antecedent thereto, shall be

Annual or semi-annual licenses, and no license
shall be issued for a less period than six months.
All annual licenses, or yearly licenses shall be dated
take effect, and be in force, from and after the first
day of the month in which they are issued, and
expire in one year from the date of such issue;
and all semi-annual licenses shall be dated
take effect, and be in force, on from and after
the first day of the month in which they are issued
and expire in six months from the date of such
issue.

Section III (27). Any person applying for a license to sell
spirits, fermented malt liquors or wines, as provided
for in this ordinance, shall execute a bond to the
City of Albany, in the sum of One Thousand
dollars, with two or more sufficient sureties, to be
approved, or rejected by the Common Council at
any regular meeting, which sureties shall justify in
in double the amount required in the bond; conditioned
that the applicant, or applicant for the license will
keep a decent and respectable house, and that he or
they will not permit any unlawful gaming, or riotous
conduct in or about either their house, nor keep open
his or their house on the first day of the week
commonly called Saturday, nor in any wise

Dispense of Spirits or fermented malt liquors
or wines on said day, that he or they will not sell
give or otherwise dispose of Spirits or fermented
malt liquors or wines to minors under the age of
twenty one years, or allow the same to be done on his
or their premises during the continuance of his or
their license.

Peculiar This Ordinance to take effect, and be in force
from and after five days after its publication.
