Ordinance no 177.

An Ordinance, to amend Sections 1 and  
2 of "An Ordinance Authorizing the  
purchasing of a Steam Fire Engine and  
providing the mode and manner of  
paying therefor"

The people of the City of Albany do  
ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Sections one and two of an Ordinance  
"Authorizing the purchase of a Steam  
Fire Engine and providing the mode  
and manner of paying therefor," be and  
the same is hereby amended to read as  
follows:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder of the City  
of Albany, be and they are hereby -  
authorized, empowered and directed

in the name of the City of Albany and for the use of the City of Albany to purchase from the Clapp and Jones Manufacturing Company of Hudson N.Y. a Clapp and Jones Steam fire engine no 4, at a price not to exceed the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred dollars (\$3600<sup>00</sup>) for the same delivered on board the cars at Hudson N.Y. ready for shipment, to be paid for as follows: \$1000<sup>00</sup> to be paid when said engine is delivered to and accepted by the City Authorities, after having been first fully tried and tested by the Fire Department of the City; \$1000<sup>00</sup> to be paid May 1<sup>st</sup> 1889 with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from the acceptance of said engine until paid; and \$1000<sup>00</sup> to be paid May 1<sup>st</sup> 1890 with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from the acceptance of said engine until by the City until paid; and \$600<sup>00</sup> or so much thereof as may be required to be paid May 1<sup>st</sup> 1891 with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum from the date of the acceptance of said engine by the City until paid, and said Mayor and Recorder are hereby authorized, empowered, and directed to enter into and execute for and in the name of the City of Albany any contract in writing with the Clapp and Jones Manufacturing Company that may be necessary and proper to carry into effect the foregoing provisions of this section. The freight on said engine from Hudson N.Y. to Albany Oregon shall be paid by the City when said engine is delivered.

Section 2. That there be and is hereby appropriated



out of the City Treasury, for the purpose of paying for said Engine in the manner and at the times herein before provided the sum of Three Thousand Six Hundred Dollars (\$3600<sup>00</sup>) or so much thereof as may be required, and the further sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100<sup>00</sup>) or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of paying the freight on said Engine from Hudson N.Y. to Albany Oregon.

Section 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its approval by the Mayor.

Passed the Council March 28<sup>th</sup> 1888.
