Ordinance No 277,

An Ordinance providing the manner in which all Taxes, and Licenses payable to the City of Albany shall be paid, and providing for the manner and time for the payment of City warrants in the order in which they are issued, and numbered, and for interest on warrants indorsed by the Treasurer, "not paid for want of funds."

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 1: All taxes, and Licenses due, owing, or payable to the City of Albany, shall be paid in lawful money of the United States of America; and City warrants shall not be received in payment thereof: provided that the City Marshal may accept, and receive City warrants in payment for City taxes now delinquent.

Section 2: That all City warrants drawn upon the Treasurer of the City of Albany after January 1st 1894 by order of the Common Council of said City shall be paid by the City Treasurer in the order in which such warrants have been or may be issued and numbered; provided, that warrants drawn upon the Treasurer for the payment of the interest on the Bonded debt of the City, and payment of the Salaries of the Police Officers of the City shall be paid when presented to said Treasurer; and the City Treasurer is hereby required to set apart a sufficient sum, annually of the first money received by him for the purpose of paying such interest and Salaries for one year, which money shall be kept as a special fund out of which the interest of the bonded debt, and Salaries of the Police force shall be paid. When a warrant is presented to the Treasurer for payment, and there are no funds in the Treasury to pay the same, he shall indorse thereon the words, "not paid for want of funds," and the date of such presentment over his signature,

And a warrant so endorsed shall draw legal interest until paid, or until notice is given by the Treasurer, that he has funds to pay the same. Notice designating the warrants to be paid shall be given by publishing the same in the official paper of the city, or if there be no such official paper then in any daily newspaper published in the city of Albany, and the interest shall cease on such warrants from the date of the publication of such notice.

Section 3: After paying the interest on the bonded debt, and the salaries of Police Officers, as hereinbefore provided, together with the annual current expenses of the city, commencing with January 1st, 1894, the overplus of the city revenue each year shall be applied by the city Treasurer in payment of the city warrants out standing on January 1st, 1894, in the order in which the same were issued and numbered.

Section 4: All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 5: This Ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from and after its approval by the Council.
