The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 4. That, Section 4, of Ordinance No. 293, Entitled, "An Ordinance providing for the material to be used in, and the manner of Constructing Sidewalks, Crosswalks, and Curbs," Approved August, 17th-1895, be, and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Section 4. Unless otherwise ordered, any person, or persons who may desire, or be directed, or required, to Construct any Sidewalk, or who may desire, or be directed or required to Construct a curb on the street in front of any sidewalk, shall place a Curbstone, or Curb plank in the street, not less than three inches in width, and four or five inches in depth, and not less than nine feet in length parallel with, and twelve feet from the front line of the lot along which such sidewalk is constructed, which curb shall be securely settled, and fastened in place, and, in case such curb is of wood, and the sidewalk does not extend thereto, such curb shall be securely fastened by extending one, or more long pins, at proper intervals over such Curb plank, upon which it shall be firmly spiked, or by driving stakes not less than four inches long, by three inches thick, be hind, and against said Curb plank, two feet into the ground, and at intervals of not more than six feet to which

Such curb plank shall be securely spiked. The spaces between the curb, and walk shall be filled with earth even with a line drawn from the outer edge of the sidewalk to top of curb. The top of curb, on all streets, shall not be less than eighteen, and not more than twenty inches above grade of gutter line of abutting street. All curb planks, and stakes, shall be of red fir, unless otherwise ordered by the council. But the provisions of this section shall not apply to the sidewalks on Vine street from south end of Vine street, to Third street, and on Eighth street, from east line of Vine street, to the east line of Railroad street, and upon Thurston street, from north line of Seventh street, to north line of Water street, which said walks are four feet in width, being the same sidewalks mentioned, and described in the first part of section three of said Ordinance No: 293.

Section 5: That, section 4, of Ordinance No: 293, and all other Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, in conflict with this Ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 6: This Ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force from, and after its approval by the Mayor.

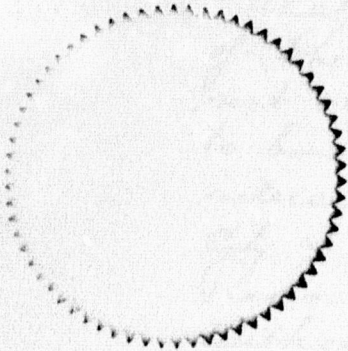
