Ordinance  
No. 321

An Ordinance Authorizing, Directing, and Empowering the Mayor, and Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, to enter into, and sign written articles of agreement, with H. B. Hankness of Albany, Oregon, for constructing, and laying an extension to Baker Street Sewer.

The People of the City of Albany, do ordain as follows:

Section 1:

That the Mayor, and Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, be, and they are hereby authorized, directed, and empowered, to enter into, and sign written articles of agreement, with H. B. Hankness, of Albany, Oregon, for constructing, and laying an extension to Baker Street Sewer, from the present north terminus of said sewer, to the Willamette River; said sewer extension to be constructed of the best quality of vitrified terra cotta pipe, 14 inches inside diameter, and according to the plans, and specifications now on file in the City Recorder's office; the price to be paid said H. B. Hankness for the construction of said sewer extension, to be at the rate of (\$1.25) - one, and 25/100 - dollars per lined foot.

Section 2:

That, this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force from and after its approval by the Mayor.

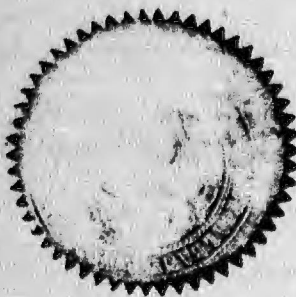
