ORDINANCE NO. 327.

Ord. No. 327 An Ordinance, authorizing, and empowering the Mayor, and Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, to enter into, and sign written Articles of Agreement, with J. E. Frick of Portland, Oregon, for constructing a "water pipe line for fire purposes in Third street, from the "Albany and Santiam" Hotel to Ellsworth Street in said city.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1: That the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany, Oregon, be, and they are hereby, authorized, and directed, and empowered, to enter into, and sign written Articles of Agreement with J. E. Frick of Portland, Oregon, for the constructing and laying of a water pipe, of 10, and 12, inch "Vitrified Iron, Stone Pipe, for fire purposes, including the filling of the trench, in Third street, from the Albany, and Santiam Hotel to Ellsworth Street, in said city, at the rate and price of 8th and 9th, per foot respectively, as set forth, and stated in the bid of the said J. E. Frick, which was submitted to, and accepted by, the City Council of said City at a regular meeting held September 13rd 1898.

Section 2: This Ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force, from, and after its approval by the mayor.
