An Ordinance providing for the material to be used in and the manner of constructing sidewalks on First Street between Washington and Elsworth Streets in the City of Albany, Oregon.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:-

Section 1: - That all sidewalks which may hereafter be constructed on First Street from the East line of Washington Street to the West line of Elsworth Street, in the City of Albany, Oregon, shall be twelve feet wide, and shall be constructed and made of artificial stone or cement.

Section 2: - Along the front of the sidewalks provided for in Section one (1) of this ordinance shall be placed a curb of artificial stone or cement twelve (12) feet from and parallel with the front line of the lot along which such sidewalk is constructed, said curb shall be not less than six (6) inches wide and not less than eighteen (18) inches deep, and each section of such curb shall be not less than five (5) feet in length.

Section 3: - All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances, in so far as they are in conflict with this Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

Section 4: - This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its approval by the Mayor.
