

## ORDINANCE NO. 379-

Passed September 8<sup>th</sup> 1903

An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor, or Recorder, of the City of Albany to enter into a contract with the Oregon Fire Alarm Company to increase the fire protection system and equipment of the City, to establish fire alarm telegraph apparatus, and to appropriate funds to be borrowed therefor.

Passed Sept 8, 1903

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section I. Shall the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany, and their successors hereinafter, and to be empowered to enter into a contract with the Oregon Fire Alarm Company to increase and have better fire protection for the use of the City, a fire alarm and fire alarm apparatus, and to pay therefor not to exceed the sum of \$13,990 lawful money of the United States which amount may be paid in cash within sixty days after the date of the invoice, shall be received by the City, or, at the option of the City of Albany, the same may be paid in two and one-half warrants for the sum of \$5,000 payable on or before December 1st 1903, and one warrant for \$1,990 payable on or before December 1st 1904, said warrants to bear interest at the rate of 6% per annum until paid.

Section II. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after approval by the Mayor.
