An Ordinance regulating the driving and moving of stock through the Public Streets and Alleys of the City of Albany, Oregon, providing the manner in which the same may be moved, and punishment for violating thereof.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drive or move any cow or cows, horse or horses, cattle or other animals through any public street or alley within the City of Albany, Oregon without having control of said animal or animals with reins or ropes or other fastening, and in the hands of some person sufficiently able to manage and control said animal or animals within the following described district in said City to-wit:-

Commencing at a point on the south bank of the main channel of the Willamette River, at the Northeast end of Thurston Street, thence Southwesterly along Thurston Street to Ninth Street; thence Westwesterly along Ninth Street to a point sixty six feet South of the South East Corner of Block Seven in McLellan's Second Addition to the City of Albany; thence Southwesterly in a straight line to the South East Corner of Block Ninety six in Montauk's Southern Addition to the City of Albany; thence Westwesterly and parallel with the North boundary line of Elm Street to the Southwest Corner of Block No. 105 in Montauk's Southern Addition to the City of Albany; thence Northwesterly along the East line of Elm Street to Fifth Street; thence Eastwesterly on Fifth Street to Maple Street; thence Northwesterly on Maple Street to Calapooia Creek; thence down said Creek following the meanders thereof to the South bank of the main channel of the Willamette River; thence down said South bank of said river to the place of beginning. Provided however, that this Ordinance shall not apply to persons driving or moving stock for market or transportation through said district above described, and in charge of a competent herder.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to drive or move any stock or animals through any public street or alley.

ORDINANCE NO. 432

Regulating the moving of Stock through the Streets

Within the City of Albany, for market, transportation or other purposes without being in charge of a competent herder, or to permit or allow the same to trespass or go upon the premises of any person, unless the owners of such stock or animals shall have first obtained permission of the owners or tenants of said premises.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's Court shall be fined not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 or shall be imprisoned in the City Jail not less than two days nor more than twenty five days, or both at the discretion of the Court.

Section 4. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after thirty days after its approval by the Mayor.
