

## ORDINANCE NO. 513

*Relating to Contract for paving Ferry Street from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>*

Ord No 513 An Ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder Relating to the City of Albany. Oregon, to enter into a contract to contract with the Warren Construction Company for the improvement of Ferry Street in said City, from the Ferry St North Curb line of Third Street, to the North Curb line first 3<sup>rd</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> of Ninth Street.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Whereas, by Ordinance No. 506, of the City of Albany, Oregon, passed by the Council on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1910, it was Ordained that the following street of said City of Albany, to-wit:

That Ferry Street from the North Curb line of Third Street, to the North Curb line of Ninth Street, be improved in the following manner, to-wit:

First: By grading said street to the proper sub-grade  
Second: By paving the roadway of said street full width, with full intersections, with Bituminous Pavement.

Third: By laying and constructing Bituminous Headers  
Fourth: By Constructing Inlets.

Fifth: By Constructing Catch Basins.

Sixth: By laying vitrified sewer pipe.

Said improvements to be made in accordance with the Charter and Ordinances of the City of Albany, Oregon, and the plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer then on file with the City Recorder of said City of Albany, and

Whereas, It was provided in said ordinance that the Recorder of said City give notice for bids for the making of said improvement in the manner provided by law and by said ordinance,

And Whereas, after due notice and advertisement for bids made and given by the City Recorder of said City, according to law, and the ordinance last aforesaid, to-wit - on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May, 1910, the Warren Construction Company, a corporation of Portland Oregon, presented to the Council of said City, its bid for the making said proposed improvement, which bid was made in due form, and in conformity with all the conditions imposed by law and by the Council, to-wit, said Warren Construction Company proposed to furnish all materials, implements and perform the labor necessary to make the above

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described improvement for the following named articles:	
Excavation, per Cubic yard.	\$ 0.75 <sup>00</sup>
Embankment per Cubic yard.	\$ 0.20 <sup>00</sup>
Bituminous Surface including the Bituminous Crushed Rock foundation and Surface finishing Course per square yard	\$ 2.00
Inlets - price per each	\$ 12.50
Catch Basins price per each	\$ 25.00
Sewer Pipe 6, inch price per linear foot	\$ 0.70
Bituminous Headers, price per linear foot	\$ 0.40

Ref Whenceas; said Warren Construction Company was  
the lowest responsible bidder for said proposed work  
and said bid was the lowest and best bid therfor.

Section 1. That the said bid of the Warren Construction  
Company for said improvement of said above described  
street be and the same is hereby accepted, and  
the Mayor and Recorder of said City are hereby  
authorized to enter into a contract, in writing,  
with the said Warren Construction Company, for the  
making of said improvement as aforesaid, on behalf  
of the City upon the terms and times in said bid;

Said Contract to provide further, that the work of said  
improvement shall commence within thirty  
days after the signing of said contract, and  
be prosecuted with such vigor that all the work  
embraced in said Contract shall be entirely  
completed on or before the first day of October  
1910, and the City of Albany shall be deemed to  
suffer damages to the extent of (\$250) Twenty five  
dollars per day for each and every day the work  
is delayed beyond said specified time; and that  
the said Warren Construction Company, furnish  
a bond in the sum of five thousand dollars to  
be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany  
Oregon, having as surety some surety com-  
pany authorized to do business in the State  
of Oregon. Conditions for the faithful per-  
formance of said contract on the part of the  
Warren Construction Company, and further  
in indemnifying the City of Albany against  
any claims or liens for labor, work or  
material, on the part of any person arising out of said Contract.

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Section 2. Whereas, the public health and safety requires that work be commenced on said proposed improvement at an early date, and before the winter rains render it impossible to properly perform the same, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval by the Mayor.
