

ORDINANCE NO. 545.

Containing into a contract for paving Ferry street from 1st to
Water street.

Ord 545 The ordinance authorizing the Mayor and Recorder
Enterling of the City of Albany, Oregon, to enter into a contract with the
Horn-Warren Construction Company for the improvement of Ferry
street for street, from the North line of First street to the South curb
paving Ferry line of ~~Water~~ street.

St. from the people of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

¶ 6 Water St Whereas, by ordinance No. 536, of the City of Albany,
Oregon, passed by the Council on the 12th day of April, 1911,
and approved by the Mayor on the 13th day of April, 1911, it
was ordered that the following street of said City of Albany, known
as Ferry street, from the North line of First street, to the South
curb line of Water Street be improved in the following manner
to wit:-

First: By grading said street to the proper curb grade
Second: By paving the roadway of said street, full width
with Bitulithic Pavement.

Third: By laying and constructing Bitulithic Headers.

Fourth: By Constructing inlets.

Fifth: By constructing Catch Basins.

Sixth: By laying Vitreous Sewer Pipe.

Said improvements to be made in accordance with
the Charters and Ordinances of the City of Albany, Oregon, and
the plans and specifications, and estimates of the City Engineer
then on file with the City Recorder of said City of Albany
and Whereas: It was provided in said ordinance that
the Recorder of said City ~~keep~~ provide for the making of said
improvement in the manner provided by law and by said
ordinance.

And Whereas: After due notice and advertisement for
bids made and given by the City Recorder of said City, according
to law, and the ordinance last aforesaid, to wit: on the
10th day of May, 1911, the Warren Construction Company, a corporation
of Portland, Oregon, presented to the Council of said City, its bid
for making ^{and} ~~and~~ improvement, which bid was made in due
form, and all the conditions imposed by law, and by the
Council, by which said bid, of said Warren Construction Company
proposed to furnish all material and implements, and perform
the labor necessary to make the above described improvement, for
the following named prices:

Excavation per cubic yard

Fill per cubic yard

Bitulithic Pavement, including all the surface finish

ORDINANCE NO. 545.

Entering into a contract for paving Henry Street from 1st to Water Street.

Bricklike Slabs, per linear foot
Catch Basins, each
Drums, each

50 cent Vitrified sewer Pipe, per linear foot

and Whereas, the Warren Construction Company
on the 10th day of May, 1911, agree in open Council to
maintain and keep in good servable condition, the Brick-
like pavement laid by it on said street for a period of five
years, also, that said sewer pipe would be laid at a cost of
65 cents per linear foot.

Whereas, said Warren Construction Company was
the lowest responsible bidder for said proposed work, and
said bid was the lowest and best bid therof.

Section 1. That the said bid of the Warren Construc-
tion Company for said improvement of said described
street be, and the same is hereby accepted, and the Mayor
and Recorder of said City, are hereby authorized to enter
into a contract in writing with the said Warren Construc-
tion Company, for the making of said improvement
as aforesaid, in behalf of the City of Albany, upon the
terms mentioned in said bid, and the agreement herein-
above mentioned.

Said contract to provide further, that the work of
said improvement shall commence within thirty days
after the signing of said contract, and be prosecuted with
such vigor that all the work embraced in said contract
shall be entirely completed, before the first day of October, 1911,
and the City of Albany shall be deemed to suffer damages to
the extent of twenty-four dollars per day for each and every
day the work is delayed beyond said specified time; and
that the Warren Construction Company, furnish a bond
in the sum of ~~one~~ thousand dollars to be approved by
the Mayor of the City of Albany, Oregon, having as surety
some surety company authorized to do business in the
State of Oregon, conditioned for the faithful performance of
said contract, on the part of the Warren Construction Com-
pany, and further indemnifying the City of Albany against
any claims or losses for labor, tools or materials on the
part of any person leaving out of such contract.

Section 2. Whereas, the public health and safety
requires that work be commenced on said pro-
posed improvement as an early date, and begin the
winter rains render it impossible to prosecute, inform
