

ORDINANCE NO. 5/2

Ore 5-78. City or license privilege for the use and manner of
improving streets, streets and alleys, in the City of Astoria, shall be
the first class, one of which, to be kept in line, shall be so a
privilege and franchise, shall be granted to all persons to the City of Astoria by
the city commissioners, who will be present, if the same shall not
be completed within the time agreed upon, in obstructions, good and
sufficient, and shall give the said license of the said person
improvements, which may be made, and the license, for carrying on
the recorder of said City of Astoria, shall be a sufficient license
improvement of said City of Astoria.

The Police of the City of Allentown do hereby certify as follows:

Section 1. Let First Street from the east line
of Harrison Street to the West curb line of Main Street, except the
intersections with Lynn, Ellsworth, Brownell and Ferry Streets, now
be improved in the following manner, to-wit:

First; regarding indirect to the former subject.

Second: It is a railway line, the roadway of said street for
miles - with gravel between pavements.

Soil investigation to be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of my City, which may be a. while awaiting specifications and estimated to the City Engineer or City, or the department of civil for the same to be in the office of the City Recorder of City of Albany on the 3rd day of February, 1872, under seal "City of Albany, County of Albany, State of New York, the improvement of Fourth Street between the east corner of Division Street to the west curb line of Main Street, and the estimated cost of work to & close on said street to the probable cost of \$100,000."

The east and west improvement, or sidewalk, on the street at the cross roads or junction thereof, to other streets, to be paid by the City of Albany out of the General Fund of said city, shall remain as per Board of Estimate and Assessment Roll, to be paid by the City of Albany, and a sum equivalent to the amount, as before made, as retained and declared by Ordinance, 1,576 passed by the Mayor and City of Albany, on the 18th day of April, 1912, and approved by the Board of Estimate and Assessment Roll, on the 20th day of May, 1912.

ORDINANCE NO. 578

Ord 5-78.

An ordinance purposing for the time and manner of improving Front Street from the East line of Main Street, West to the west curb line of Main Street, in the City of Albany, to the amount of \$10,000.00, to be paid by the City of Albany by the person or persons now in or ever in occupancy of the same, shall be completed within the time agreed upon, and the giving of bond and sufficient security shall be given by the owner or owners of the work, that no damage will be done to said street, and nothing shall be given to the Recorder of said City office notice of bills for the construction of such improvement of said street, as heretofore.

The People of the City of Albany doth ordain as follows:

Section 1: Let Front Street from the east line of Main Street to the West curb line of Main Street, except the intersections with Lyon, Ellsworth, Broadalbin and Ferry Streets, be improved in the following manner, to-wit:

First: 130 feet long said street to the proper elevation.

Second: 130 having the roadway of said street full width with full intersecting sidewalks, perpendicularly.

Third: 130 feet on each side of said street between the leaders.

For the: Building acting attorney.

Fifth: Building attorney.

Sixth: 130 feet on each side of said street.

Building attorney to make in accordance with the said ordinance, in City, all necessary plans, specifications and estimates, to the Orderer of said City, for the improvement of said Front Street, in the office of the City Recorder of the City of Albany on the 1st day of February, 1872, endorsed "City of Albany plans and estimates for the improvement of Front Street from the east line of Main Street to the west curb line of Main Street, and the estimated cost of the work to a clear road street \$10,000 probable cost \$12,000."

The cost of said improvement to be paid by the person or persons now in or ever in occupancy of the same, to be paid by the City of Albany, at the regular time of said city's bills, making payment to the said building attorney and to the City Recorder to pay him for the same, and for advertising about and outside the improvement made, are henceforth declared to be Ordinance No. 578 passed by the People of the City of Albany, on the 12th day of April, 1872, and approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany on the 12th day of April, 1872.

ORDINANCE NO. 575

on the lots and parts of lots adjacent to said portion of said road, and to be so improved, and especially as abutting upon heritable beds, as provided by the charter, and by L.S.

The improvement of said street shall be completed by the first day of January, A.D.

All bids for improving & making permanent said street deemed reasonable by the Board of the City of Albany, in writing, or otherwise, corporation or person will be allowed to enter into contract, may be entered into by said City for the sole improvement, and sole managing and controlling at the time of signing such contract, make, execute and deliver to said city of said contract without bond, note good and sufficient security in the amount of \$5,000.00 for the actual performance of said contract.

Section 2. After giving notice to the corporation or person entering into any contract with the said City of Albany to make said improvement of said road, the Board of the City of Albany shall have the time mentioned and specified in such contract, said City shall be deemed to suffer damages and not bound to the payment of \$5.00 per day, for each and every day the completion of said work is delayed, notwithstanding the stated time in such contract, the amount shall remain between the contractor and the city at the rate of \$5.00 per day, which was the time of the conclusion of making of said contract, unless the time of the conclusion of making of said contract is extended by the Board of the City.

Call to meet, when & will be dependent on the weather and convenience.

Section 3. The Board of the City is empowered to call a meeting of the Board of the City, give a due notice for bids of the improvement of said street, or part thereof, if no bidding are made to call a meeting of the Board of the City, or any part thereof, to consider the same, and to accept the bid, as soon as sufficient public notice has been given, and notice given to the Board of the City, or any part thereof, of the time and place of doing the same, and the cost of said street.
