

ORDINANCE NO. 597.

Ord. 597

An ordinance providing for the time and manner of improving Third Street from the West curb line of Baker Street to the West curb line of Railroad Street, providing now the rest of such improvement shall be built, the manner or damage to the City of Albany if the person or persons making such improvements, if the same shall not be completed within the time above mentioned, and the giving of a written and sufficient bond for the payment for payment of the work of such improvement to railroad street, providing for the giving of a recorder of said City of notice for bids for the completion of such improvement of said part of said street.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. That Third Street from the West curb line of Baker Street to the West curb line of Railroad Street shall be improved in the following manner, to wit:

First. By grading said street to the present high water mark.
Second. By paving the roadway of said street, full width, with macadam intersections, with concrete pavements.

Third. By laying and contracting concrete roads.

Fourth. By constructing an iron fence.

Fifth. By laying a fine sewer here.

Sixth. In consideration to consider the accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany, concerning the plans and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer of the City, of the improvement of said three streets, for him the office of the City Engineer of the City of Albany on the 23rd day of May, 1912, endorsed "City Engineer" upon and received his plan for the improvement of said street, to wit, "to lay the West curb line of Third Street to the West curb line of Railroad Street and the entire street of the work to be done on said street across the parallel lines thereof."

The cost of said improvement of said portion of said Third Street at the crossings or intersections thereof by other streets to be paid by the City of Albany out of the general fund of said City, the remaining portion of the cost of said improvement of said Third Street, shall be paid one-half by funds collected and arising upon and out of the assessment of concrete on each assessment and demand and balance in sums passed by the council of said City of Albany at the 13th day of May, 1912, and approved by the Mayor, and of City at the 13th day of July, 1912, on the land and lots of real estate belonging to said portion of said Third Street to be so improved, and

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especially and particularly benefited thereby, as provided by the charter of said City.

The improvement of said Third Street shall be completed by the first day of October 1862.

All bids for the making of said improvement of said street shall be received and rejected by the Council of the City of Albany, may be rejected.

Any firm, person or corporation entering into any contract may be entered into by the city for the making of said improvement, shall before commencing said improvement, and at the time of signing such contract, give security and deliver to said city a good and sufficient bond, with good and sufficient security in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars for the faithful performance of such contract.

Section 2. No person or corporation entering into any contract with the said City of Albany to make said improvement of said Third Street shall not complete the same within the time mentioned and specified in said contract, and city shall be deemed to suffer damages or account thereof to the amount of \$25.00 per day for each and every day the completion of said work is delayed beyond the time stated in said contract, which amount shall be paid by such contractor doing the work at the completion thereof, unless the time of the completion of said improvement is extended by the Council.

All paving, it shall be laid in suitable mortar, or using concrete, and not otherwise.

Section 3. The recorder of said city is hereby ordered and directed to immediately give notice for bids for the making of said improvement of said portion of Third street, by publishing such notice ten days in the Albany Evening Herald, a daily newspaper published in the said City of Albany, in a convenient manner, to the time and manner of doing the work of said improvement of said Third street.

The improvement of said Third Street shall be completed by the first day of October 1912.

All bids for the making of said improvement of said street deemed untrue, made by the council of the City of Albany, may be rejected.

Any firm, person or corporation with whom any contract may be entered into by the city for the making of said improvement, shall before commencing the same, present it, and at the time of signing such contract, shall execute and deliver to said city a bond and sufficient bond with good and sufficient surety in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars for the faithful performance of such contract.

Section 2. No person or corporation entering into any contract with the said City of Albany to make said improvement of said Third Street shall not complete the same within the time mentioned and specified in said contract, and city shall be deemed to suffer damages or account thereof to the amount of \$20.00 per day for each and every day the completion of said work is delayed beyond the time stated in said contract, which amount shall be paid by such contractor doing the work at the completion thereof, unless the time of the completion of said improvement is extended by the council.

All pavement shall be laid in suitable material, or using concrete, and not otherwise.

Section 3. The recorder of said city is hereby ordered and directed to immediately give proper notice for bids for the making of said improvement of said portion of Third Street, by publishing such notice ten days in the Albany Evening Journal, a daily newspaper published in the said City of Albany, in the territories in and about the Hulse and Garrison Streets, the work of said improvement to run Third Street.
