

ORDINANCE NO. 696.

ord 696
An ordinance requiring the present holder of the franchise
granted by Ordinance No. 147 of the City of Albany, Oregon, to repair Water
Street, from Thurston Street to Railroad Street so that the railroad track
shall not obstruct travel upon said street.

Whereas by Ordinance No. 147 of the City of Albany, Oregon,
passed by the council October 26, 1886, approved October 30, 1886, Oregon
and California Railroad Company was granted a right of way over Water
Street in the City of Albany, Oregon, which grant reserved the right to the
council of the City of Albany to prescribe the manner of such use at any
and all times when the council may consider the public welfare of the City re-
quires it so to do and which said grant requires that the track shall be
unobstructed as not to obstruct travel; and

Whereas in the opinion of the council of the City of Albany, the
public welfare requires that Water Street from Thurston Street to Railroad
Street shall be repaired and filled in with gravel so that conveyances
may pass over trackage upon said street.

Therefore:

The People of the City of Albany Do Ordain As Follows:

Section 1. That Oregon and California Railroad Company or its
lessee, the Southern Pacific Company, and they are hereby required within
60 days from the approval of this ordinance, to repair and place in good
condition, Water Street, in the City of Albany, Oregon, from Thurston Street
to Railroad Street by grading the same in such a manner as to
conveyance to readily cross the said track of the said Oregon and
California Railroad Company.
