

ORDINANCE NO. 118.

Ord 678. An ordinance creating and regulating the fire department of the City of Albany. Rep 1507

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. That the Fire Department of the City of Albany shall consist of a chief engineer, an assistant Engineer, president, a secretary, a treasurer, a board of control, consisting of five members, and an armament as now composed or as may hereafter be admitted by the by-laws and regulations of the department, and shall be known as Albany fire Department.

Section 2. There shall be an election on the second Monday of December, 1873 and annually thereafter for chief engineer and assistant engineers and fire officers of the said department; notice of such election shall be given by the Secretary of said fire department, by publication at least twice in a daily newspaper published in the City of Albany, not less than fifteen nor more than ten days before the date of said election, and by posting a notice of said election Tuesday before said election at the entrance to the fire station of said department. The board of control shall appoint to conduct said election time convenient to the department, it so will subscribe to an oath or affirmation to faithfully discharge their duties. Said election shall be held at the fire department ready room and the polls for such election shall be opened at one o'clock P.M. and close at 6:30 o'clock P.M. The voting shall be by ballot and immediately upon the closing of the same, the votes shall be publicly counted and the returns of said election immediately forwarded to the Secretary of the department, and by him transmitted to the board of control who shall convene within ten days thereafter, canvass the returns, make out, sign and file with the Secretary of the department a statement of the result of said election. The person having the highest number of votes of chief engineer shall be declared elected for the term of one year and until his successor is elected and qualified. The person having the highest number of votes of assistant engineer shall be declared elected as first assistant engineer in the term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and the person receiving the highest number of votes in the board of control shall be declared elected members of said board of control. If a person so elected at the time of his election is not in good standing the fire department shall be qualified to elect another in his place, and if any person after his election as a member of the board of control shall cease to be a member

in good standing of the Albany Fire Department; his office shall immediately become vacant.

Section 3. Inserted sections of chief engineer and assistant engineer. If either section of chief engineer and assistant engineer is not decided by a majority of the board of control and more than half vote over to either of said offices, the board of control shall determine who shall be entitled to said office.

Section 4. The chief engineer and assistant engineer shall each be liable to assess \$2.00 or a treble sum for failure to perform his duties at any time within the city limits, and fine to be collected by the treasurer of the Albany Fire Department, and no excuse shall be received or such a sum or failure except for sickness of such officer or of some member of his family or his absence from the city at any time of 20 days.

Section 5. When a vacancy occurs in the office of chief engineer, the assistant engineer shall immediately become chief engineer for the unexpired term and thereafter the foreman of the Albany fire department shall become assistant engineer for the unexpired term.

Section 6. The chief engineer and assistant engineer and members of the board of control shall enter into the duties of their respective offices by each subscribe to an oath or affirmation to faithfully and to the best of his ability perform the duties of his office and they upon so doing shall be entitled to a certificate of service signed by the president and secretary of the department. The persons so elected under the provisions of this ordinance shall enter upon the discharge of the duties of their respective offices on the first Monday of January of each year succeeding their election and qualification.

Section 7. The chief engineer shall receive an annual salary of \$100.00 which shall be paid semi-annually to the treasurer the same as other claims against the city, with the result that in case the Chief Engineer shall be absent from the city for more than fifteen (15) consecutive days during his term of office, then and in that case the proportionate sum salary which would have been received by him owing to the Chief Engineer in case he remained in the city, shall be paid to the assistant engineer, as otherwise agreed to the city, and the amount so paid to the assistant engineer shall be deducted from the salary of the Chief Engineer.

Section 8. In the absence of the chief engineer and assistant engineer of the fire department or their inability to act, the foreman of the department is hereby authorized and empowered to act as chief engineer and clothed with all the powers and authorities of such chief engineer.

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Section 9. On or before the first day of January in each year, the Board of Aldermen shall elect a fire chief engineer, who shall be a member of the Fire Department, and shall be appointed by the Board of Aldermen for a term of one year.

Section 9. The persons acting in the capacity of chief engineer in case of a fire in any part of the city, shall, whenever he shall deem it necessary, employ any person and team to haul each fire engine and apparatus to and from such fire and contract that the city of Albany shall pay for such service rendered in the day time not exceeding \$2.50 and for such service rendered in the night time not exceeding \$5.00.

Section 10. The Albany Fire Department shall be allowed for ordinary expenses the sum of \$3000 per quarter, the same to be paid quarterly to other claims against the city are paid and the Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant upon the Treasurer for such quarterly amounts.

Section 11. No person shall be allowed to vote at any election for chief engineer or assistant engineer unless he shall have been a member of the Fire Department for thirty days next preceding such election and no person shall be eligible to any office in the department without possessing the qualifications of a voter.

Section 12. At its annual meeting the Fire Department shall elect a foreman, two assistant foremen, the first, secretary and treasurer who shall hold their offices for one year and until their successors are elected and qualified and all vacancies occurring in such office shall be filled in such manner as the by-laws of the department shall prescribe.

Section 13. The Albany Fire Department shall have power to make rules, regulations and by-laws, or its own government not inconsistent with the ordinances of the City of Albany.

Section 14. The council shall either direct work to be done in the city, or let and award contracts for the erection and maintenance of houses hereafter to be built. All proposals for work and supplies shall be opened in the City Engineer's office of a majority of the committee on public works and buildings, without undue delay, and awarded to the Council which shall award the contract to the lowest responsible bidder or bidders. All work done for, and supplies required, to said department shall be under the supervision of the City Engineer and a majority of the committee on fire and water, and they shall certify all bills for such work and supplies.

Section 15. The chief engineer shall report to the council the quantity, location and condition of all water and fire apparatus of whatever nature or kind, and the state and condition of the company houses, and all property of the city in the custody and charge of said department, and all accounts by fire which may have

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taken place with the causes thereof, and a description of the property destroyed and injured, with the names of the owners of the same, and also the extent of the loss thereof; whether the property or any part thereof was insured, and if so, in what amount, and shall also report the expenses incurred by the city in maintaining the department and other expenditures for the department during his term of office, and such other information and recommendations as he may deem proper. He shall further more inquire into the cause of fires and declare that a person or persons criminally connected therewith are diligently prosecuted by the proper authorities.

Section 17. That whereas to whom any person elected to the office of Chief Engineer or Assistant Engineer of the Fire Department of the City of Albany, shall fail or refuse to qualify and enter upon the duties of his office as required by Section 6 of this ordinance, within one month from the time mentioned in said section, then said office of Chief Engineer or Assistant Engineer, as the case may be, shall be deemed vacant.

Section 18. All ordinances heretofore existing relating to the Fire Department of the City of Albany and especially Ordinance No. 691 and Circular Letter No. 2 hereby repealed.
