

## ORDINANCE NO. 70-01

Recorded in the City of Albany

December 7, 1941. - Warranted adopted.

One ordinance making it unlawful to permit card playing, dice throwing or other games of chance in any public place in the City of Albany and making it unlawful for any person to buy cards, dice, checkers or other game or chance in a public place in the City of Albany, proclaiming what shall be deemed playing cards and providing a penalty or violation thereof.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Any person who in the course of his occupation or employment in any cigar store, public barbershop, public pool room, hotel, livery stable, or any public place within the City of Albany shall permit any person or persons to engage in any game of cards, dice, checkers, or other game or chance of any kind or nature in said cigar store, public barbershop, public pool room, hotel, livery stable or any public place in the course of his occupation or employment or otherwise shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof before the Clerk of Court shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars or imprisonment not exceeding twelve months and shall pay all costs of prosecution and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 2. Any person who shall engage in any game of cards, dice, checkers, rummy or other game of chance in any public place within the City of Albany shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor upon conviction thereof before the Clerk of Court shall be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars or imprisonment not exceeding twelve months and shall pay all costs of prosecution and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 3. For the purpose of law enforcement, the carrying of a deck of cards or a portion of a deck of cards by any person within the City of Albany, which deck of cards shall consist of the original deck of cards less than ten cards, shall be deemed a conviction for having cards or a portion of a deck of cards in a public place.
