726 Rep 1506 An ordinance declaring it unlawful for any person to walk upon or to sit in, & honor to travel the streets, alleys, or other public place in the City of Gresham over the original boundaries in which such intoxicating liquors are imported into the City of Gresham.

Whereas the carrying of intoxicating liquors through the streets, alleys, or other public places of the City of Gresham is the cause of much disturbance and disorder among the inhabitants, and is also a source of considerable inconvenience, annoyance and disturbance of the peace, quietude and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Gresham;

Therefore,

The People of the City of Gresham Do Ordain as follows:

Section 1. Any person or persons who shall carry, and transport on a street, alley, or any other public place within the City of Gresham any intoxicating liquor, whether kept in original packages in which such intoxicating liquors are shipped into the City, in cans, barrels, kegs, &c. shall be deemed guilty of an offense.

Section 2. Section 1 of this ordinance shall not be construed to prohibit any trade, manufacture or commerce, or buying, selling, or holding, or dealing in any article, including, but not limited to, liquors, or any kind of merchandise, except as hereinafter provided, nor to prohibit any manufacture, sale or sale with the law, or by, the laws of the State of Oregon.

Section 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$100.00, and not more than \$500.00, to be paid into the City treasury, and to be collected by the Mayor and City Council in the name of the City, and to be used for the support and maintenance of the police force.

Section 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be liable to a fine of not less than \$100.00, and not more than \$500.00, to be paid into the City treasury, and to be used for the support and maintenance of the police force.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect at once.
