

In Ordinance providing for the time and manner of building and constructing a lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak Street sewer, where said sewer crosses Santiam Road in Albany, Oregon, and running thence Southwesterly on the same angle as said Santiam Road a distance of 815 feet in the City of Albany, Oregon, bounding now the cost of such work amounting to shall be, or is, the payment or damage to the City of Albany by the persons or persons making work in improvement, the sum to be not completed within the time agreed upon, and the giving of good and sufficient bond, for the faithful performance of the work of such improvement, and providing for the giving by the Recorder of said City of Albany of proper notice for bids for the construction of said improvement.

The People of the City of Albany do Ordain as Follows:

Section 1. That there shall be constructed an eight inch vitrified terra cotta sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak Street sewer where said sewer crosses Santiam Road in Albany, Oregon and running thence Southwesterly on the same angle as said Santiam Road, a distance of 815 feet, in the City of Albany, Oregon.

Said improvement shall be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany, Oregon, and amended plans and specifications and estimates of the City Engineer of said city for the construction of said lateral sewer filed in the office of the Recorder of said City of Albany on the 28th day of December, 1914.

The cost of said lateral sewer shall be paid out of the funds collected and arising out of the assessments to be made, ascertained and declared by ordinance on the lands and parts of lots adjacent to said improvement so to be made and especially and particularly hereinafter described as provided by the Charter of said City.

The said sewer shall be completed by the 15th day of April, 1915.

All bids for the making of said improvements deemed unreasonable by the council of the City of Albany may be rejected.

Any person or corporation with whom any contract may be entered into by the city for the making of said improvement before commencing said improvement and at the time of signing said contract, shall, execute and deliver to said city, a good and sufficient bond with good and sufficient surety to be approved by the Mayor of the City of Albany in the sum of \$30,000 for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 2. If the aforesaid corporation entering into any contract with the said City of Albany to make an improvement shall

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not complete the same within the time mentioned and specified in said contracts, and it shall be deemed to suffer damages on account thereof to the amount of \$1000, ending for each and every day after the completion of said work is delayed beyond the time stated in each contract, unless payment shall be paid by such contractor doing the work at the completion thereof, unless the time of the completion of said improvement is extended by the council.

Section 3. The recorder of said city is hereby directed to immediately give public notice to all, of the making of said improvement by publishing such notice all days in the Albany Daily Democrat, a daily newspaper or journal in the city of Albany, publishing, without giving prior notice the time and manner of doing the work of said improvement.
