

An Ordinance providing for the time and manner of building and constructing a lateral sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak Street being a sewer mainway between Seventh and Eighth Streets, and running thence easterly across Block 1, across Pine Street, and 168 feet into Block 2, all in Harkmann's Woodland Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon, providing for the cost of said improvement shall be paid by the people of Albany to the City of Albany to the person or persons making such improvement if the same is not completed within the time agreed upon, and the sum of \$1,000, a good and sufficient bond for the faithful performance of the work of said improvement, and providing for the time of payment according to County usage of paper notice for bids for the completion of said improvement.

The People of the City of Albany do ordain as follows:

Section 1. That there shall be constructed an eight inch vitrified terra cotta sewer beginning at the manhole in Oak Street trunk sewer, mainway between Seventh and Eighth Streets, and running easterly across Block 1, across Pine Street, and 168 feet into Block 2, all in Harkmann's Woodland Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon.

Said improvement shall be made in accordance with the charter and ordinances of the City of Albany, Oregon, and plans, specifications and estimates of the City Engineer, and city or the construction of which may be filed in the office of the Recorder of said City of Albany on the 8th day of April, 1914.

The cost of said lateral sewer shall be paid out of the moneys collected and arising out of the assessments to be made, ascertained and declared by ordinance on the lots and parts of lots adjacent to said improvement so as to be ample and especially and particularly benefited thereby as provided by the charter of said city.

The said sewer shall be completed by the 1st day of July, 1915.

All bids for the making of said improvement deemed unreasonable by the City of the City of Albany may be rejected.

Who so ever, firm or corporation who may and contract may be entered into by the city for the making of said improvement shall begin commencing said improvement on but the time of signing such contract made, execute and deliver to said city a good and sufficient bond with good and sufficient security to be held by the Mayor of the City of Albany in the sum of \$1,000.00, for the faithful performance of said contract.

Section 2. If the person, time or condition entering into and

ent to build the said City of Albany to make said improvement shall not complete the same within the time mentioned and specified in said contract, said city will be deemed to suffer damages in account thereof to the amount of \$1.00 per day for each and every day the completion of said work is delayed beyond the time stated in such contract, which amount shall be paid by such contractor doing the work at the completion thereof, unless the time of the completion of said improvement is extended by the Council.

Section 3. The Recorder of this city is hereby directed to immediately give proper notice of it for the making of said improvement by publishing such notice ten days in the Albany Advertiser and Herald, a daily newspaper published in the said City of Albany, giving in said notice the time and manner of doing the work of said improvement.
