

## ORDINANCE No. 810. ✓

An ordinance to regulate and restrain establishments where gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for hire, to provide for the closing of such establishments between certain hours and upon the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, to provide a penalty for the violation thereof and to repeal Ordinance No. 402 entitled "An ordinance to regulate and restrain establishments where gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for hire, and to provide for the closing of such establishments between certain hours and upon the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof"; approved April 1, 1905, and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict therewith.

The People of the City of Albany Do Ordain As Follows:

Section 1. No person duly licensed to engage in keeping a billiard or pool room, or other gaming establishment, in the City of Albany, shall allow or permit any minor to visit, loiter about or frequent his place of business or play at any game in said place of business without the written consent of his parent or guardian or minor, such duly licensed person shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's court be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than ten dollars, or by imprisonment in the City jail for not less than five nor more than ten days or by both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.

Section 2. Any person engaged in keeping or running on any establishment where public gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for hire shall keep such establishment open between the hours of twelve o'clock midnight and six o'clock in the morning or upon the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, such person shall upon conviction thereof before the Recorder's court be punished by a fine of not less than ten nor more than twenty-five dollars, or by imprisonment in the jail for not less than five days nor more than ten days, or by both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the court.

Section 3. An ordinance now entitled "An ordinance to regulate and restrain establishments where gaming is carried on or where billiard or pool tables are kept for hire, and to provide for the closing of such establishments between certain hours and upon the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof" approved April 1, 1905, is and the same is hereby repealed.

Section 4. All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
