

# ORDINANCE NO. 923

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE EIGHTEEN HUNDRED (\$1800.00) DOLLARS OF THE STREET FUND OF THE CITY OF ALBANY, OREGON, FOR THE PURPOSE ON ONE REPUBLIC MOTOR TRUCK, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That there be and is hereby appropriated out of the Street Fund of the City of Albany, Oregon, the sum of Eighteen Hundred (\$1800.00) Dollars for the purpose of purchasing of the Albany Garage of Albany, Oregon, one Republic Motor Truck, Model "A", for the use of the street department of said City.

Section 2. The Recorder of the City of Albany is hereby authorized and directed to draw a warrant against the Street Fund of the City of Albany for the amount hereby appropriated and in favor of the Albany Garage, and for the uses and purposes hereinabove set forth.

Section 3. Whereas it is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public, peace, health and safety of the inhabitants of the City of Albany that this ordinance shall become immediately effective, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.
