A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 87 OF ORDINANCE NO.633, MATITIED * AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION, RESCTION, RAISING, LOWERING,
ALTERATION, REPAIRING AND USE OF BUILDINGS, AND TO PROVIDE FOR PROTECTION AGAINST FIRE, TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES AND PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT WITH
THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE. *PASSED BY THE COUNCIL ON THE 28th May OF
APRIL, 1915.

THE PROPLE OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

by amended to read as follows; Section 57, "Every building hereafter erected within the fire limits shall be constructed in accordance with the requirements of
this ordinance for the construction of buildings of either class "A", class "B"
or class "C" except dwellings of flats not exceeding two stories in height, or
business houses not exceeding one hundred(100) feet in length and fourteen feet
in height, outside bearing walls, which may be constructed of concrete, concrete
blocks, brick tile or their equivalent. The walls shall not be less than eight (8)
inches in thickness. The eight inch bearing walls, shall be reinforced with piers
not less than twelve(12) inches by sixteen(16) inches and at a distance not to
exceed seventeen feet on centers, fire walls shall not be less than eight (8)
inches in thickness.
