

ORDINANCE No. 1187

AN ORDINANCE providing for the holding of a special election in the City of Albany, Oregon, on Monday, July 20, 1925, for the purpose of submitting to the legal voters of said City, for their adoption or rejection, certain measures and charter amendments, all as appears by Resolution No. 7, adopted on the 25th day of March, 1925; Resolution No. 13, adopted on the 17th day of June, 1925; Resolution No. 20, adopted on the 17th day of June, 1925; Resolution No. 21, adopted on the 17th day of June, 1925, and Resolution No. 22, adopted on the 17th day of June, 1925; designating the places for holding such special election, appointing the judges and clerks for such special election, and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That for the purposes set forth herein, and in the manner provided by law, and this ordinance, a special election shall be held in the City of Albany, Oregon, on Monday, July 20, 1925, commencing at the hour of eight o'clock A.M., and continuing until the hour of eight o'clock P.M. of said day.

Section 2. Except as herein otherwise provided, said special election shall be conducted in the same manner as general elections in said City are conducted. The following places are hereby designated as the places of holding such Special Election:

- First Ward: Maple Street School Building.
Second Ward: City Recorder's office in City Hall.
Third Ward: Madison Street School Building.

Section 3. The following persons are hereby designated and appointed judges and clerks of said Special Election, in the respective wards, as follows, namely:

Section 4. That previous to entering upon the discharge of their respective duties said judges and clerks shall take and subscribe an oath in the following form, to-wit:

"I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support the constitution and laws of the United States and of the State of Oregon; that I will perform the duties of judge (or clerk as the case may be) of election according to law and to the best of my ability, and I will studiously endeavor to prevent fraud, deceit and abuse in conducting said election." Said oath to be administered to the judges and clerks by an official authorized to administer oaths, and in the absence of any such official, then one of the persons chosen to act as judge is hereby empowered to administer the oath to the judges and clerks of the election, and the person administering the oath shall cause an entry thereof to be made and subscribed by him and prefixed in the poll books.

Section 5. That if any judge of said special election, as above named, shall fail to attend and serve at said election, the voters present may elect another in his place, and if any clerk named shall fail to attend and serve at said election then the judges of said election may appoint another in his place.

Section 6. The City Recorder shall give notice of said Special Election by publication thereof in the Albany Democrat-Herald, a newspaper of general circulation published within the City of Albany, Oregon, once a week for four consecutive and consecutive weeks prior to the date of such election, and also by posting notices thereof in four public places within the City of Albany, Oregon, and in four public places in the territory proposed to be annexed and described in Resolution No. 22, and as set forth in Section 10 hereof, for a like period and in the manner provided in the charter of said City.

Section 7. That at said special election proposed amendments to the charter of the City of Albany, Oregon, and measures shall be submitted to the legal voters of said City for their adoption or rejection, which said amendments and measures are submitted by Resolution No. 7, adopted by the Council on the 25th day of March, 1925, and Resolution No. 13, adopted by the Council on the 17th day of June, 1925, and Resolution No. 20, adopted by the Council on the 17th day of June, 1925, and Resolution No. 21, adopted by the Council on the 17th day of June, 1925, and Resolution No. 22, adopted by the Council on the 17th day of June, 1925.

Section 8. The Recorder shall cause to be printed in pamphlet form a

true copy of the ballot title and text of each proposed amendment and measure submitted, with the number at which the ballot title thereof will be printed on the official ballot, as provided in and by said Resolutions Numbers 7, 19, 20, 21, and 22, and shall mail a copy thereof to each voter in the city of Albany, Oregon, whose address he may have, not later than five days before the date of said election, upon which date said measure is to be voted upon. Preceding the copy of such act shall be a statement that the same will be submitted to the legal voters of the City of Albany at a special election to be held in said City on Monday, July 20, 1925.

Section 9. That the City Recorder shall cause to be printed and shall supply a sufficient number of ballots, copies of poll books, ink, pencils, stationery and other necessary and proper supplies for said election, and the marshal shall install voting booths and deliver ballot boxes and other supplies to the said judges and clerks of election at said voting places in due time for their use by the voters, judges, clerks, and others interested in said special election, at the time of holding the same.

Section 10. That for the purpose of submitting the question of annexation of the territory described in said Resolution No. 22, to the qualified legal voters of such territory, for their adoption or rejection, a Special Election shall be held in such territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the southwest corner of Block 6, in City View Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon; thence easterly along the north side of Ninth Street in said Addition to the southwest corner of Block 5 in said Addition; thence southerly along the eastern side of Liberty Street, if extended, southerly in a direct line to the north line of Block 3, in Linnmont Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon; thence easterly along said north line, and its extension, to the east line of Takema Street; thence northerly along the east line of Takema Street to the southwest corner of Block 1 in said Linnmont Addition to said City; thence easterly along the north line of Klamath Street, and its extension, to the intersection with the east line of the County road leading from Albany to Tangent, now known as the Pacific Highway; thence southerly along the eastern boundary line of said Highway to a point where the south line of Multnomah Street if extended easterly in a direct line intersects the said east line of said Pacific Highway; thence westerly to the northeast corner of Block 7 in Linnmont Addition to the City of Albany; thence southerly along the east line of said Linnmont Addition to the southeast corner of Block 9, in said Addition; thence westerly along the south line of said Addition, if extended, to a point due north of the northeast corner of property now owned by the Board of Trustees of Albany College a corporation; thence south to the northeast corner of the property now owned by the Board of Trustees of Albany College, a corporation; thence southerly 10 1/4° west 40.57 chains; thence west 12.2 chains; thence north 10 1/4° east to a point due south of the southwest corner of Block 4, in Albany Heights' Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon; thence north along the western boundary of Albany Heights' Addition to the northwest corner of Block 2 in said Addition; thence easterly along the north boundary line of said Block 2, and the northern line of Block 4 to the northeast corner of Block 4 in said Addition; thence northwesterly to the southwest corner of Block 17 in City View Addition to the City of Albany, Oregon; thence northwesterly along the east line of what is known as West Street in said City View Addition to the place of beginning.

Said Special Election in said territory shall be held on Monday, July 20, 1925, at the same time and in the same manner as provided in this Ordinance for the holding of special election in the City of Albany, Oregon, as hereinabove designated, and in accordance with the charter of the said City.

That the following named place within said described territory is hereby designated as the place of holding such Special Election, therein, to-wit:
Residence of W.H.Howard, Fourteenth Street, near Cottage Street.

The following named persons are hereby designated as judges and clerks of said Special Election in said territory, to-wit:

Section 11. WHEREAS, existing conditions are such that this Ordinance is necessary for the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Albany, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force immediately from and after its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.


