ORDINANCE NO. 1215

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 5 of Ordinance No. 948 of the City of Albany, Oregon, entitled "An ordinance regulating the traffic of vehicles in the city of Albany, and providing a penalty for violation thereof, and declaring an emergency," passed by the Council July 19, 1919, and approved by the Mayor July 10, 1919, and amended by the Council July 10, 1919, and approved by the Mayor July 10, 1919.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

That section 5 of Ordinance No. 948 of the City of Albany, Oregon, entitled: "An ordinance regulating the traffic of vehicles in the City of Albany, and providing a penalty for violation thereof, and declaring an emergency," passed by the Council July 9, 1919, and approved by the Mayor July 10, 1919, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: Section 5. It shall be unlawful to leave any vehicle standing upon any street or other public way of the City of Albany, Oregon, within ten feet of any fire hydrant or in a manner so as to obstruct any street crossing for pedestrians. Any vehicle left standing upon any street in the City of Albany within the following described area, to-wit: Beginning at the northwest corner of First and Washington Streets and running thence southerly to the southwest corner of Third and Washington Streets, thence easterly to the southwest corner of Third and Lyon Streets, thence southerly to the northwest corner of Fifth and Lyon Streets, thence easterly to the northeast corner of Fifth and Lyon Streets, thence northerly to the south east corner of Third and Lyon Streets, thence easterly to the southeast corner of Third and Baker Streets, thence northerly to the northeast corner of First and Baker Streets, thence westerly to the place of beginning, shall be left on the side of the street in which it is required to be driven, and placed with the rear right wheel not more than eight inches from the curb and the front right wheel not more than five feet and not less than three and one-half feet from the curb, and all vehicles used upon the streets must be kept moving or else be placed along the curb in the manner provided in this section; provided, however, that upon the following streets, to-wit:

First Street between Washington and Lyon Streets,
Second Street between Ferry and Lyon Streets,
Lyon Street between First and Fifth Streets,
Ellsworth Street between First and Second Streets,

all vehicles when left standing shall be placed on the right hand side of the street with both right hand wheels thereof placed within 18 inches of the curb and no closer than two feet from any other vehicle standing on such street.

No vehicle shall be left standing in the same place for more than one hour at any one time between the hours of 7 o'clock A.M. and 6 o'clock P.M. upon the following streets, to-wit:

First Street between Washington and Lyon Streets,
Second Street between Ferry and Lyon Streets.

Section 2. WHEREAS, the public health, peace and safety of the City of Albany, Oregon, requires that this ordinance should become immediately effective, therefore an emergency is declared to exist, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.


