ORDINANCE NO. 1323

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 575 of the City of Albany, Oregon, Greeken entitled:

An ordinance granting to Gregon Electric Railway Company, a corporation, its successors and assigns, the franchise, or right to lay, construct and maintain street car tracks or other railway tracks, and to operate street cars, or other cars thereover, and to transport passengers, mail, baggage and express thereon, and also freight upon certain conditions, and to erect, construct, maintain and operate power, telephone and telegraph lines in the City of Albany.*

Passed by the Council April 10, 1912, and approved by the Mayor April 12, 1912.

THE PROPLE OF TH. CITY OF ALBAIY TO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

"Section 1. That Ordinance 575, entitled: "An ordinance granting to Oregon Electric hailway Company, a corporation, its successors and resigne, the franchise or right to lay, construct and maintain sreet car tracks or other railway tracks, and to operate street cars or other cars thereover, and to transport passengers, mail, baggage and express thereon, and also freight upon certain conditions, and to erect, construct, maintain and operate power, telephone and telegraph lines in the city of Albany, " Fessed by the Council April 10, 1912, and approved by the Mayor April 12, 1912, be and the same is hereby amended by addings Sections 18, 19 and 20 thereto to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 13. Said Oregon Electric Railway Compant, its successors and sesigns, may abandon its tracks on Fifth Street from the west side of Elm Street to the east side of Main Street, (hereinsfter designated as Fifth Street track) its side track on Fifth Street in front of passenger depot between Ellsworth and Baker Street, (hereinafter designated as depot side track) and the Wye track running from Fifth Street track south on Baker Street, (hereinafter designated as Baker Street Wye track,) and may cease to maintain or opente said Fifth Street track, depot side track, and Baker Street Wye track, and/or to run trains thereon, on

the following conditions, to-wit:

(1) Said Oregon Electric Esilway Company, its successors or assigns, shall on or before the 9th day of November, 1929 file with the City Recorder (a) Notice of its intention to abandon and to cease to use and/or operate said tracks,

and (b) its acceptance of conditions of abandonment as in this ordinance specified.

(2) Said Oregon Electric Railway Company, its successors and assigns, on or before the 1st day of June, 1930, but not until and after it has filed said notice of intention and acceptance of the conditions of abandonment as specified in the preceding sub-division (1) of this ordinance, and as and inferformance of the conditions upon which it may abandon said Fifth Street track, depot, and track and Baker Street Lye shall:

side track and Baker Street Wye, shall:

(a) Remove all rails and all brick on outside of each rail and one line of brick next to each rail on inside from said Fifth Street track and from the portion of depot side track which is west of the east line of Lyon Street.

(b) Remove all loose and/or broken brick in track area.

(c) All ties shall remain, except where rotten, which commisses, with black-All ties shall remain, except where rotten, which shall be removed, and

(d) All of the abandoned Fifth Street track area, including area in that part (d) All of the abandoned Fifth Street track area, including area in that part of depot side track west of east line of Lyon Street, shall be filled and paved with blacktop or asphalt concrete, in such a way and to such a width as will marge into the adjacent prement without leaving any holes or depressions.
(e) No rails or brick eith between or outside of rails shall be required to be removed, unless loose and/or broken, from that part of depot sidetrack east of east line of Lyon Street, or from Baker Street Wys track, but flanges between rails and bricks shall be ascurely and evenly filled in with black top or asphaltic concrete and temped, and if practicable, remaining brick coated with black top or asphaltic concrete. black top or asphaltic concrete.

(f) None of the above work shall amply to that part of Fifth Street track intersecting Main Street, and as to such Main Street track area Oregon Electric hall way Company shall be required to remove its rails and ties and bring vacated

track area up to grade with gravel.
(3) All overhead trolley lines, guy wires and connections alon; abandoned track shall be removed, but poles carrying high voltage transmission line may remain and continue in use.

(h) All of the above work to be done in a got; and workmanlike manner, and subject to the approval of the Superintendent of Streets. All black top to be according to City of Portland specifications.

Section 19. Oregon Electric Railway Company in and by its acceptance of the conditions of abandonment as hereinsbove provided shall promise and agree to assume the maintenance of the area vacated by its said tracks and the work done by it, and to guarantee to maintain and keep same in repair and in good condition as the remainder of the adjacent Fifth Street up to and until April 12, 1937.

Section 20. Nothing herein contained shall in any manner be held to prejudice, affect or interfere with any of the rights, privileges and franchises of the oregon Aleotric Railway Company, its successors and assigns, as granted and established
