

ORDINANCE NO. 1427

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING the Council of the City of Albany to purchase from the B.F. Goodrich Company, 400 feet of 2½ inch fire hose for the Fire Department of said city, and appropriating the sum of \$500.00 in payment thereof and declaring an emergency.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, is hereby authorized and directed to purchase of the B.F. Goodrich Company 400 feet of 2½ inch hose for the use of the Fire Department of said City at and for the agreed price of \$500.00.

That there be and is hereby appropriated from the general funds of said city the sum of \$500.00 for the payment of said hose and the Recorder of said city is hereby authorized and directed to make, execute and deliver the general fund warrant of said city to the said B.F. Goodrich Company on presentation of their bill therefor, provided the same shall have first been approved and allowed by the Council in said amount.



Whereas the peace health and safety of the people of the City of Albany require that this ordinance shall become immediately effective, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall become in full force and effect upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.


