

ORDINANCE NO. 1477

AN ORDINANCE authorizing the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany to enter into a written contract with Del Huston and John Suesens, partners, doing business as Huston & Suesens for furnishing the labor and materials necessary to paint the Albany Airport Hangar and oil shed and appropriating the sum of \$236.00 for said purpose, and declaring an emergency.

WHEREAS, the Council has heretofore obtained bids for labor and materials necessary to paint the Albany Airport Hangar and oil shed and have accepted the bid of Del Huston and John Suesens, partners doing business as Huston & Suesens for said labor and materials, which said bid is now on file with the Recorder of said City and in which said bid the said Huston & Suesens agreed to furnish all labor and materials necessary for doing said work for the sum of \$236.00, which said bid was the lowest and best bid obtainable therefor.

THEREFORE, THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Albany are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Del Huston and John Suesens, partners, doing business as Huston & Suesens for furnishing the labor and materials necessary to paint the Albany Airport Hangar and oil shed with one coat of asphalt base aluminum paint trimmed with first class ready mixed lead and oil paint, said contract to provide among other things that said work shall be completed on or before August 5, 1939, and that the contract price therefor be paid when said work is completed and accepted by the Council.

Section 2. That there be and is hereby appropriated from the General Fund the sum of \$236.00 in payment of the above mentioned contract price and that the Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to issue a General Fund Warrant in the sum of \$236.00 payable to the said Huston & Suesens when said work is finally accepted by the Council.

Section 3. Whereas the peace, health and safety of the people of the City of Albany require that this ordinance shall become immediately effective, therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be and become immediately effective upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
