

ORDINANCE NO. 2692

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND MANNER OF IMPROVING DAVIDSON STREET FROM 8TH AVENUE TO THE SOUTH LINE OF HIGHWAY 99; PROVIDING HOW THE COST OF SUCH IMPROVEMENT SHALL BE PAID, PENALTIES, BONDS AND NOTICE FOR BIDS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

RECITALS:

1. Resolution No. 387 the Council determined it's intention of improving Davidson Street from the existing pavement of Highway 99 to 8th Avenue in the following manner:
 - a. base course
 - b. grading
 - c. drainage
 - d. curb & gutter
 - e. asphaltic concrete paving
2. The adjacent property owners benefitted by the said improvement have filed a waiver of remonstrance with the Recorder.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: Davidson Street from the existing paving on Highway 99 to 8th Avenue be improved in the manner set forth in Resolution No. 387 in accordance with the plans and specifications filed with the Recorder on August 22, 1956.

Section 2: The cost of improvements above described where required shall be at the expense of the City and shall be paid out of the funds provided therefore in the budget of the city. The remaining portion of the costs of the improvements shall be assessed against the real property especially and particularly benefitted by the improvements as provided in the Charter of the City.

Section 3: Said improvements shall be completed as provided in the plans and specifications. If the contractor making the improvements shall not complete the same in the time specified, the City shall be deemed to suffer damages in the sum of \$50.00 per day for each day of delay unless the contract time shall be extended by the Council upon application of the contractor.

Section 4: The contractor receiving the contract for the above improvement will be required to furnish a bond to guarantee faithful performance of the contract and shall comply with all Federal, State and Charter provisions concerning the same.

Section 5: The Recorder is ordered and directed to give notice for bids by publishing an invitation to bidders in a newspaper of general circulation published within the city.

Section 6: Inasmuch as the provisions of this ordinance are necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health and safety of the citizens of the City of Albany, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage by the Council and its approval by the Mayor.


