TITLES AN CROINANCE ANNEXING TRACTS 19 TO 29, INCLUSIVE, RODGERS ACRES ADDITION, LINN COUNTY, OREGON, TO THE CITY OF ALBANY AFTER VOTE IN FAVOR OF SAID ANNEXATION BY THE PEOPLE IN THE TERRITORY TO BE ANNEXED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

RECLIALS:

WHEREAS, on the 23rd day of September, 1959, a regular council meeting of the Council of the City of Albany, Oregon, did duly pass Ordinance No. 2866 wherein it was provided that public hearing be held on the 28th day of Uctober, 1959, concerning the advisability of annexing a portion of the property in Rodgers Acres Addition, Linn County, Oregon, to the City of Albany, and

WHEREAS, it was further directed by the council that an election be held within the territory considered for annexation to determine whether a majority of those owning property in the territory desired to be annexed to the City of Albany and pursuant to this direction, an election was duly held after due notice was given as provided by law and it was determined that eight voters were in favor of the annexation of the territory and one vote opposed, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the people of the City of Albany that Tracts 19 to 29, inclusive, Rodgers Acres Addition, Linn County, Oregon, be annexed to the City of Albany,

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY

That the following described property be and it is hereby annexed to the City of Albany, Oregon:

Tracts 19 to 29, inclusive, Rodgers Acres Addition, Linn County, Oregon.

Section 2: EMERGENCY CLAUSE

Inasmuch as the annexation of the above described property is necessary to protect the immediate health, peace and safety of the people of the City of Albany and those in the territory to be annexed, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall become immediately effective upon its passage by the council and approval by the mayor.
