

ORDINANCE NO. 3298

AN ORDINANCE DEFINING JUNK, PROHIBITING THE KEEPING THEREOF IN CERTAIN PLACES IN THE CITY OF ALBANY AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: JUNK. The term "junk" shall include all old motor vehicles, old motor vehicle parts, abandoned automobiles, old machinery, old machinery parts, old appliances or parts thereof, old iron, or other metals, glass, paper, old lumber, old wood, or other waste or discarded material.

Section 2. It is hereby determined and declared that the keeping of any junk out of doors on any street, lot or premises within the City of Albany, or in a building that is not wholly or entirely enclosed except doors for use for ingress and egress, is a nuisance and is unlawful.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, or the agent or employees of any person to keep any junk out of doors on any street, or on any lot or premises within the City, or in a building that is not wholly or entirely enclosed except doors used for ingress and egress.

Section 4. The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to junk kept in a duly licensed junk yard or automobile wrecking house.

Section 5. That any person, firm or corporation violating this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or imprisonment in the City jail not to exceed six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
