

ORDINANCE NO. 3497

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING EQUITABLE RATES AND A LICENSE FEE FOR SEPTIC TANK CLEANING TRUCKS, USING CITY OF ALBANY SEWAGE TREATMENT PLANT SERVICES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: LICENSE

Before any septic tank cleaning truck shall make use of the City of Albany sewage treatment plant services, they shall first obtain through the office of the City Recorder, a license. The charge for a license fee is hereby fixed at the sum of \$5.00 per truck. The license fee shall be renewable annually.

Section 2: USER FEE

There is hereby established a fee of \$25.00 per 1,000 gallon or less truck load delivered and deposited for treatment in the sewage treatment plant. For each 500 gallons or part thereof in excess of 1,000 gallons, there shall be an additional \$3.50 per load charge.

Section 3: INDEMNITY BOND

Before any load of septic tank sewage shall be received for treatment at the City of Albany sewage treatment plant, the owner or operator of the truck making the delivery shall file with the City Recorder of the City of Albany an indemnity bond in the amount of \$10,000.00. The bond shall provide that the principal thereon shall protect the City of Albany from any and all claims arising out of the operation of the truck and shall further indemnify the City from any loss or damage resulting out of the deposit of any toxic material in the sewage treatment plant by the owner or operator which toxic material may cause loss or damage to the sewage treatment plant.

Section 4: EMERGENCY CLAUSE

WHEREAS, the peace, health, and safety of the people of the City of Albany require that this ordinance become immediately effective, therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its final passage by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
