

ORDINANCE NO. 3860

TITLE: AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN BRYANT'S PARK AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF ALBANY DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1:

It shall be unlawful for any person to possess an alcoholic beverage in Bryant's Park in the City of Albany. For the purpose of this ordinance, an alcoholic beverage shall be considered any beverage having an alcohol content of more than 1/2 of 1 percent by volume.

Section 2:

Notwithstanding prohibition against the use or possession of alcoholic beverages in city parks set forth in other ordinances of the City of Albany, the City Manager shall have the right to issue a special permit for the use and possession of alcoholic beverages in the park.

Section 3:

Any person or organization may request a permit referred to in Section 2 hereof, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) Payment of a \$10 fee
- (b) The name and address of the applicant shall be furnished, together with an estimate of the number of persons who will be participating.

Section 4:

The granting of a permit referred to in Section 2 above shall be discretionary with the City Manager and if issued, such conditions may be attached thereto as will be in the best interests of peace, health and safety of all citizens.

Section 5:

Inasmuch as the peace, health, and safety of the citizens of the City of Albany requires the immediate effectiveness of this ordinance, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance shall become in full force and effect upon its passage by the City Council and approval by the Mayor.
