
**WHEREAS, Benton County has statutory responsibility for selecting ambulance service providers for each Ambulance Service Area in the county; and**

**SUBJECT: Benton County Ambulance Service Area Plan**

As required by statute, Benton County has completed an Ambulance Service Area (ASA) plan, which has been approved by the State Health Division. The new plan effectively grants the City of Albany a five-year franchise for the Benton County areas covered by city ambulances.

The only pertinent change over the draft agreement was to decrease from ten to five years the length of time before Benton County goes out for new RFP's. For this reason, I did not route the new plan to the City Attorney and Finance Director.

Ray Broomfield has applied to Benton County for a position on its Emergency Medical Services advisory board which will oversee application of this plan. If he is selected, it will ensure our input into this ASA.
