Call to Order

Chair Frankie McCullough called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Roll Call

Members present: Chair Frankie McCullough, Vice-Chair Nolan Streitberger, Chuck Kratch, Nicole Case, Alex Rice, and Daniel Koenig

Members absent: Will de la Rocha (excused)

Staff present: Civil Engineer I Andrew Monaco, City Manager Peter Troedsson, Civil Engineer III Chris Cerklewski, and Engineering Clerk III Anita Dodd

Approval of January 27, 2025, Minutes

5:31 p.m.

Chuck Kratch moved to approve the minutes as presented, Daniel Koenig seconded the motion, and the motion passed 5-0.

Public Comment

Commissioner Nicole Case joined the meeting at this time.

Scheduled Business

5:31 p.m.

Civil Engineer III Chris Cerklewski attended to address questions about Ferry Street. Cerklewski explained that although the northern segment qualifies as a residence district, lowering the posted speed alone would not slow traffic without major physical changes. Most traffic-calming options are not feasible on this collector road. He recommended requesting an Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) speed study, which would likely support a 30-mph limit.

Alex Rice moved to recommend a speed zone request for 30 mph to ODOT, Koenig seconded the motion, and the motion passed 6-0. Koenig requested that the location be flagged for future evaluation, for street and traffic improvements when the roadway is reconstructed.

Business from the Commission

Kratch raised concerns about worsening street conditions and urged the City to pursue long-term funding solutions, prompting a discussion with City Manager Peter Troedsson about limited

staffing, rising maintenance costs, and potential tools such as a street maintenance fee or local fuel tax.

Chair McCullough emphasized the need to stop delaying action and asked how real progress could be made.

Kratch then invited online guest Billy McGregor from the Albany Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (AAMPO) to provide a brief update on upcoming funding cycles and regional planning, and Cerklewski explained how the City works with AAMPO on project applications.

Troedsson concluded by thanking the commissioners for their service and highlighting the importance of public education on transportation issues.
